Special dietary requests will be catered for as long as this has already been specified on your registration form and communicated to the conference team.



Please return crockery to the Conference Café so they can be washed and ready for the next day.





The social, economic, and sustainable relevance of the Academy of Marketing Conference 2024 is reflected in the collaborative planning and implementation of all aspects of the event from its location to the small business locally sourced conference consumables, merchandise and entertainment.

A Walking Conference

The conference location, city centre hotels, the reception venue at the National Museum of Wales and the conference gala dinner at Mercure Cardiff Holland House hotel are all within short walking distance.

Paperless

The conference will be paperless. All materials are published online and can be accessed via the QR code printed on your delegate badge. If you have a specific need for a printed copy of the programme, please let a member of the registration team know on arrival.

Plastic free

Each delegate will receive a reusable water bottle. Please refill the bottle at the chilled water dispenser in the PTC foyer. All food and drink packaging are biodegradable

The wayfinding signage and banners around the conference venue will be upcycled into tote bags. After the conference, these will be delivered to Cardiff University Remaker Space. The team will cut and sew tote bags that can be purchased after the conference.

Catering

In line with the Public Value ethos of the conference all catering is provided by local small businesses with a positive impact on society, a low carbon footprint and sustainable credentials.

The majority of ingredients are locally sourced, and all items prepared, cooked and baked by Welsh small business enterprises – Big Moose, Let Them See Cake, Manumit Coffee Roasters (see sponsors section of this document).

We aim to reduce food waste; any leftover food will be collected at the end of the day and redistributed to local charities. In addition, on Thursday, delegates can grab a lunch pack if they cannot stay for lunch due travel



arrangements. Vegetarian, vegan, gluten free and other dietary requirements will be catered for. Please make sure you have indicated your dietary requirements on the registration form.

Catering is plastic free; all packing and labelling are biodegradable.

Crockery and cutlery have been sourced using the most sustainable option available to us – after detailed research and consideration of the viable options we decided to hire these items which will be delivered and collected to be cleaned and returned to event every day.




Getting to and around Cardiff – our host city


Cardiff is an easily accessible city. It has high-speed rail links from London; the M4 motorway passes the north of the city and an airport. The University is in the centre of the city.

The environmental impacts surrounding academic conferences can be significant, especially associated delegate travel carbon emissions. We recommend that (where possible) delegates consider using public transport when travelling to Cardiff and active travel during the conference. Did you know that travelling by public transport is in many cases comparable in terms of time and price, but also has a lower carbon footprint impact? For example, on average travelling by train produces around 85% less CO2e emissions than flying and 60% less CO2e emissions than driving.

By Train

Cardiff is less than two hours from London by rail with trains leaving and arriving every 30 minutes. Cardiff also has direct routes to Bristol, Bath, Birmingham, Manchester, Nottingham, and other main towns and cities. Cardiff Central Station is conveniently located in the city centre, close to many hotels and the university (a 30-min walk from Cardiff Business School). Cardiff Cathays Station, a 9-min walk, is the nearest train station to Cardiff Business School.

Taking the Eurostar to London St Pancreas is quick and easy with direct connections from Paris, Amsterdam, Brussels. Onward travel to Cardiff from London Paddington.

Please note essential work will be carried out from 3rd July to 16th July 2024 at the Severn Tunnel train tracks. Trains to London will be rerouted via Gloucestershire - train journeys from Cardiff to London will increase by 1 hour.

By Coach

Cardiff is easily accessible by coach from major UK cities. Coach travel is the cheapest form of travel in the UK. The main companies to run routes from most of the major cities and airports to Cardiff are National Express, Megabus and Flixbus.

By Air

Cardiff Airport has direct flights between Edinburgh, Belfast, Dublin, Paris, Amsterdam, it also has connecting routes to worldwide destinations. Cardiff Airport is connected by public transport to the City Centre which is 13 miles away. Frequent public transport links to Cardiff City Centre by shuttle bus & rail or bus.

Bristol Airport has a large number of direct and connecting destinations and is less than 50 miles from Cardiff. From the airport, either take the <u>Bristol International Flyer Bus</u> which connects with trains to Cardiff at Bristol Temple Meads train station or take a direct coach to Cardiff.

London Airports - Cardiff is easily accessible from all major London Airports by either coach (see above) or rail from London Paddington.

By Car

Cardiff is easily accessible using the M4 motorway. The M4 runs through the north of the city, from London; from the Midlands, the North of England and Scotland it is a has access on the M6, M5, M50 and M4. From the South and Southwest of England Cardiff can be reach on the M5 and M4.



Please note, there is very restrictive, limited pay as you go (PAYG) parking at Cardiff University. Car Parking at Cardiff University is controlled by Nexus and we at Cardiff Business School have no control over the policing or car parking violation fines. Entrance and exit to the site is monitored by number plate recognition and the site is monitored by Nexus enforcement officers.


Presenter Instructions




